Scott Armstrong is president and CEO of Group Health Cooperative, one of the nation's largest consumer-governed health care systems. Armstrong has been with Group Health since 1986—in positions ranging from assistant hospital administrator to chief operating officer (COO). He became CEO and president in January 2005.

Armstrong has more than 20 years of experience in health care and was the assistant vice president for hospital operations at Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton, Ohio, before joining Group Health. He is a board member of the Alliance of Community Health Plans (ACHP), America's Health Insurance Plans (AHIP), the Seattle Chamber of Commerce, and The Pacific Science Center. He's also a founding board member for OneHealthPort (a secure portal to access online services from Northwest health organizations), a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives, and he concluded a stint as a board member of the Washington State Hospital Association.

Armstrong received a Bachelor of Arts from Hamilton College in New York and a Master of Arts in business with a concentration in hospital administration from the University of Wisconsin–Madison. He, his wife Sarah, and their two daughters live in Seattle.
